






Question 3: Staff encourage children to behave well by having good relationships and high expectations



Question 5: This school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year




Question 6: There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school (broad and balanced curriculum)









Question 18: What else could this school do to improve further?

The curriculum is not enriched by enough visits and experiences for the younger children, my child is in class one and has not been on a trip!! Other local schools and others in the trust do this, I do feel ASPS lag behind on this. I don't have an overview of what she will/is learn/ing and the class blog is never updated. You definitely need to do more in include parents. My child has 100% attendance but we see those with dire attendance rewarded when they manage a full week! Definitely do more to encourage those doing the right thing.

Could do with an app/report at end of thr day for the nursery side so parents can be more involved and aware of what their child has been up to through the day.

Some platform for parents to see more of what is going on at school I understand that something is in motion for this and excited to see it in action.

X's only in Fs2 and so far everything has been great, no improvements needed.

More notice on non uniform days e.g. children in need theme, as by the time we are told usually most things are out of stock.

More updates on class pages to show parents what the children are doing in class time.

More praise for children not just "learner of the week" boosting the child's confidence more

Focus on inclusivity, some children don't feel as involved in class activities and play time activities as others.

Question 18: What else could this school do to improve further?

Provide reading books to stimulate young minds I.e. matches, their interests, hobbies or personalities, non fiction/autobiographies such as little people.

With our recent success at the Olympics and female lionesses football win, there should be introduction in extra curriculum in sports and form school teams respectively to inspire the children and learn about other skills

Introduce drama and acting to present a school play once a

year to parents. (Skills).

When they say my child can have support, follow this through. Still waiting for bereavement/ feelings/ emotions support from April.

Encourage children to eat their meals more at lunchtime.

Take into understanding families situations before judging and calling meets so quickly... the attendance protocol is far too extreme

School app- to share learning, photographs of learning, behaviour rewards.

Less emails...sometimes I miss emails as there are so many coming every day.

Perhaps 1 email per day with all info on would be good.

Consistency between classes - some staff care more and support more than others.

events - every significant date during the year has a pj day. no thought or effort goes into arranging something that would excite the kids or get them involved, as other schools do We dont have rock star day as others do and the summer fayre is embarrassing in comparison

Question 18: What else could this school do to

improve further?

Get children to wash their hands more especially after each play time (particularly those in FS1/2) due to small children always putting their fingers in their mouth and don't always realise how dirty their hands get when playing outside, resulting in children then getting ill, catching colds etc.

Answer the phone faster. I've rung multiple times when returning a call and got my self worried with how long it took to speak to someone. I've called before school also and the answer phone came on saying the school was closed, i was calling at the time indicated by the answer phone.

Take children's mental wellness more seriously when they are clearly struggling and saying there are bullying issues that are effecting them and causing them to physically not want to come into school.

Encourage children to eat their meals more at lunchtime.

We including my child find your behaviour policy very degrading ... the fact that their name goes on the board in front of peers and my child's exact words are is that it is embarrassing when his peers name go on the board or when his goes on the board.. an employer would not discipline a member of staff in front of colleagues... I have on several occasions witnessed in the playground children coming up to their friends and saying things like wasn't it funny when you was in red today. Or remember when you was in red earlier and then laughing .. resulting in that child being left upset .. this is horrible to witness especially when the child who has been on red has SEN and doesnt always understand. Or can't always control there behaviour. My child is scared daily of getting into trouble and doesn't feel supported. He is now on a daily basis asking to move to another school.

Question 18: What else could this school do to improve further?

Take away their traffic light system as they see it as a threat and are scared to ask for what they rightfully should be allowed to do, such as putting their hands up to go to the toilet to then be told No, then moved from green to amber on the system and if they get to red they are punished as they have to go to the thinking room for simply needing the toilet which they should rightfully be allowed no question asked because you cannot command a wee. They are not robots, but they are scared to ask, so they wet themselves

As a parent, I would like to have access to the curriculum to know what issues and topics are covered in lessons.

I think parents should be me more informed about the learning program in the future.

This school needs to change there behaviour policy. It is an outdated policy that expects children to be disciplined the day after.

Behaviour should be dealt with straight away.

Due to staff adhering to school policy my child's emotional well-being as suffered and nothing as been done to address this.

Maybe sometimes, on the odd occasion, it would be beneficial to scrap the curriculum for a day, and freestyle some learning of life, outside of the box. I want my child to do well, but I honestly feel that sometimes we let Education get in the way of learning. Too much pressure on academics, when some kids have so much to offer in practical ways, that if they are able to show it, would excel in other areas because it would boost their confidence. I don't feel this is a fault of school, more the system!

With huge rises in costs, particularly in relation to coach hire, we have to be mindful of the implications for school and

		•	This academic year two year groups have already enjoyed a visit out.
		•	In addition to educational visits, we also try to arrange visitors into school to enhance childrens' learning. In recent months this has included our Spanish Day and, most recently, we arranged for an owl display for our EYFS children. In January, KS1 also have a visitor planned (but we won't spoil that surprise!).
		•	By the end of this academic year we hope that all children will have the opportunity to participate in an educational visit.
		•	Finally, the local sports competitions are now resuming to pre-covid levels and we will continue to participate in these. The cross-country event in October was attended by all KS2 children and most recently our Y5/6 girls were crowned football champions, not losing a single game at their tournament at Barnsley College (3)

To enhance communication with Parents, our EYFS staff have also begun to send out a monthly newsletter that details what the children are currently learning about.
	More praise for children not just 'Learner of the Week' to boost confidence	 In addition to Learner of the Week, we do have other forms of praise and reward in school. Children are able to earn success stones for their 'team', can receive stickers and/or visit other teachers/staff to share their amazing work. Children who visit Mrs Sanderson and/or Mr Wheelwright have their photo and achievement shared on our Praise Page on the website too. All children in class work towards being 'Class of the Week' too and the winners receive the trophy and £5 for their class to bank and spend within the school year.
	The attendance protocol is far too extreme	• As with all schools, we have to follow strict Government guidelines in relation to school attendance. In addition, to meet safeguarding guidelines, we are required to conduct safe and well visits when children are not in school. Our attendance policy is graduated and it is always our intention to work with, and support, families to enable good school attendance.
	The behaviour policy is outdated children see it as a threat	• Our behaviour policy seeks to balance rewards and incentives on offer for children who behave in line with school expectations, while having appropriate sanctions for those children who do not follow our school rules. It is important that children show respect and follow rules, a skill for life. Where inappropriate behaviour occurs, we seek to respond in a restorative manner and allow children to reflect and take responsibility.
	Get children to wash their hands more often	• The children wash their hands regularly throughout the day, including before and after break, lunch and other activities. In addition, our EYFS children always wash their hands when returning inside from their outdoor play. Since the pandemic, we have observed more frequent and effective handwashing on the children's part.
No.	Introduce drama and acting and have a school play once a year	 Pre-covid a whole school show was held in July each year. We are hopeful that this tradition will resume this academic year. The whole school helps prepare, including scenery, prop and costume design, with our KS2 children performing on the night, singing and acting. To develop performance skills we also have our KS1 choir & KS2 Glee Club This year we have tried to broaden our after school and lunch time activities offer including our Eco Group and the Debating Club.
